The recipient will receive a one-time disbursement upon scholarship award to apply to their college expenses.

The application process is open to all graduating high school seniors:

- Whose family is a member in good standing of Beth-El Congregation
- Who will enter college in the fall semester of the calendar year in which the scholarship is awarded

Please complete the attached scholarship application carefully and completely. You may attach additional pages as necessary or type the complete responses on separate pages. You may include letters of recommendation from teachers, rabbis, educators, youth advisors, employers or others, if you desire.

Your application will be evaluated by members of the Beth-El Congregation's Men of Reform Judaism's scholarship committee, who may select a few applicants for personal interviews. You will be notified if you are selected for an interview. The scholarship award winner will be notified in advance of the public announcement. The scholarship award will be presented at the annual Mickey Goldman Spaghetti Supper. Please ensure that you will be available to receive the award in person. You may be asked to say a few words at the dinner on Sunday, March 25, 2018.

**** Be sure to include a copy of your high school transcript reflecting your GPA and class standing, as well as a copy of your SAT or ACT scores. Photocopies are acceptable. ****
